

What is Drexel HOPE?

Drexel HOPE provides high quality, compassionate health services for opioid dependence, HIV, and Hepatitis C. We offer low-threshold care at reduced or no cost, which makes medical services more accessible to underserved patients. We work to advance health equity and decrease health disparities among Philadelphians.

Services include:

- Opioid dependence treatment, including buprenorphine (Suboxone) and naltrexone (Vivitrol)
- Support during opioid use disorder recovery
- Training and tools for overdose reversal and prevention
- HIV and Hepatitis C testing and treatment
- Medication to prevent HIV (PrEP) and safer sex resources
- Connection to local resources for wellbeing and further medical care
- Community education to reduce stigma about all the above.
